## **EQUIPPING LOCAL PASTORS**

The major focus is to help equip the Pastors who come from the more remote village areas and who have little or no formal bible college training. Yearly workshops are held to encourage these pastors. All pastors receive free Ministry and Leadership manuals.



## MINISTERING TO THE POOR

Church of Hope is Partnering with Pastors who are planting churches in the slums of Bangalore. Part of their ministry is feeding the poor and helping with other practical needs. The Pastors are praying for a financial support base which will enable them to give those in the slum areas a hot meal each day. All money which is donated into our overseas missions Care Account will go towards meeting practical needs such as these.
